What Do We Do?

Interfaith helps:

- † thousands of people receive assistance with food, housing, rent, utilities, medical services, and other necessities, totaling a cash value in excess of \$800,000,
- † more than 280 families each year receive food and / or gifts at Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas through the Adopt-A-Family program,
- † children receive over 1400 Christmas gifts of their choice,
- † over 200 children in New Albany receive meals daily through the Snack Attack Café,
- † More than 1,250 senior volunteers contribute over \$3,300,000 worth of service to 160 agencies throughout southern Indiana,
- † homebound persons receive daily telephone calls of reassurance,
- † More than 150 teens start the school year with new clothes, and
- † Hundreds of children start the school year with a backpack and school supplies,
- † by building collaborations between organizations, businesses, government and the churches to create real, lasting change in our community.

Our Programs:

Family Services: Individuals and families in need receive emergency financial assistance and food. Family Services also coordinates *Clothe-A-Teen*, *Operation Santa Claus*, and the *Adopt-A-Family* programs.

Retired and Senior Volunteer Program: Our (5 county) RSVP program provides meaningful opportunities for retired and senior adults to volunteer and at the same time provide help to the agencies and healthcare institutions that need it.

Dial-A-Care Telephone Reassurance: Volunteers call homebound, frail elderly, and individuals with disability daily to check on their well-being and safety.

Snack Attack Café Partnership: In collaboration with the New Albany Parks & Recreation Department, the New Albany Housing Authority, The Salvation Army, and Dare to Care children are served a nutritious meal after school every day.

Youth Development Services: Interfaith is promoting healthy and positive youth development though collaborative efforts with community leaders.

Self Sufficiency: Interfaith believes that every family deserves to be self sufficient and works in collaboration with many other organizations to assist local families toward that goal.
